

University Counsellor/Psychologist

The University of Manitoba Student Counselling Centre (SCC) invites applications for a full-time appointment at the rank of Instructor I. This term position is expected to begin in March 2021 (depending on the availability of the successful candidate) and will extend until June 30, 2022. Salary is negotiable depending on training and experience.

The successful candidate will provide counselling services for university students experiencing personal, social, educational, and career concerns. They will also be involved in a combination of other activities, including program development, outreach, crisis intervention, consultation to faculty, staff, and students, and university and community service. Opportunities will be available to pursue relevant counselling interests (e.g., development of group programming for students) and supervisor support will also be offered. This position will be based at the Fort Garry campus location of the University of Manitoba and the work hours will normally be 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday. A benefit package and professional development support accompanies this position.

A doctoral degree in Counselling or Clinical Psychology is preferred. Candidates possessing a Master's degree in a Counselling Profession (e.g., Clinical Psychology, Counselling Psychology, Social Work, Marriage and Family Therapy, or Counselling) will also be considered. The preferred candidate must have a minimum of two years of supervised counselling experience with adults (please detail this training in your cover letter). As well, the preferred candidate must have familiarity with diversity (e.g., Indigenous persons, persons with disabilities, international populations) and experience working with these populations. Counselling experience with students attending a postsecondary institution is preferred. Assets include experience with acute and complex trauma, crisis response, psychological assessment, and community outreach. A commitment to the promotion of a positive campus community, including the ability to work effectively in a multidisciplinary service delivery environment, with a richly diverse population of students, staff, faculty, volunteers, and administrators is important.

The University of Manitoba is strongly committed to equity and diversity within its community and especially welcomes applications from women, members of racialized communities, Indigenous persons, persons with disabilities, persons of all sexual orientations and genders, and others who may contribute to the further diversification of ideas.
