- Overseeing and providing critical incident stress management services, that include organizing and delivering debriefing sessions for employees who have experienced a critical incident in the workplace, and providing other workplace interventions.
- Recruiting and overseeing the work of a Peer Support Network that promotes and supports the EAP interventions.
